[1] If incoming students' theory placement exam results do not place them in Music Theory I and Musicianship I, they will instead take MUSC 1000: Fundamentals of Musicianship before proceeding to Theory I and Musicianship I. This is a workable option, but will of necessity cause the student to need to take some summer courses in order to graduate within four years'/eight semesters' time.

[2] As of Spring 2019, there is only one course the University offers that fulfills GLOB and ETH simultaneously. It is EDUC 4250: Economics and Geography for Global Sustainability. Students may elect to fulfill GLOB and ETH separately from each other, but this is possible only if the student takes a summer course or is bringing in transfer credit upon matriculation (AP credit, dual enrollment, etc.).
