# Advising Information for the Transfer Credit from the Army Command and General Staff College AY2003-2008

This advising paper describes the Transfer Credit Agreement between the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College (CGSC) and Webster University. This agreement provides an opportunity for qualified CGSC resident students and graduates to complete the following Webster University masters degrees in residence or online:

Master of Business Administration Master of Arts in Management Master of Arts in Human Resources Management Master of Arts in Procurement and Acquisition Management Master of Arts in Information Technology Management Master of Arts in Business and Organizational Security Management Master of Arts in International Relations

### Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.)

The master of business administration (M.B.A.) program provides training in business for students interested in understanding the working nature of business in a competitive environment. Courses in the M.B.A. program integrate information and theories from various disciplines, including accounting, economics, finance, marketing, production operations, and strategic management. The objective of this program is to develop students into broadly educated business managers and executives who understand the nature of business as a whole, with the tools and techniques applicable to a wide variety of business situations. The capstone for the M.B.A. program gives students the chance to bring together all of the theories, skills, and tools studied during the program and integrate them into a learning experience that highlights the nature of competition and the kind of strategic maneuvering that must be done in order to succeed.

\*Students entering in or after academic year 2012-13 must follow current MBA requirements, which only require 6 SH of elective work.

Note: Program prerequisites are to be completed before beginning coursework for the MBA for those students who have not completed prerequisite courses (or an appropriate equivalent) within five years of entering the program and having earned a grade of B or better. If the appropriate prerequisite course content was completed more than five years prior to entering the program, the department will allow a waiver if the student demonstrates command of the content area by successfully completing a waiver examination. Prerequisite courses may not count as electives in the 36-credit-hour MBA.

### Master of Arts in Information Technology Management (ITM)

The Master of Arts in Information Technology Management degree requires satisfactory completion of 24 credit hours of the ITM curriculum and 12 credit hours of graduate electives for a total of 36 credit hours. The student chooses elective courses offered in this major, from the program curricula of other Webster University School of Business and Technology majors.

Qualified CGSC students enrolled in the M.A. in Information Technology Management are awarded 12 semester hours of transfer credit, which is applied as 3 semester hours of required core courses and a 9 semester hour elective course. # **Masters in International Relations (INTL)**

The Master of Arts (M.A.) in International Relations enables CGSC students to add to their military studies in analyzing the complexities and processes involved in world politics and international affairs. Webster University coursework provides exposure to the key subfields of the international community and relevant issues such as globalization, human rights, humanitarian action, and economic development. This program is ideal for CGSC students continuing their military career at the joint operational and strategic levels of service, to include governmental agencies, intergovernmental organizations, nongovernmental organizations, or multinational corporations. This program is also recommended to students planning to pursue a Ph.D., or an academic career at other institutions.

### **Program Curriculum**

The 36 credit hours required for the Master of Arts (M.A.) degree must include the following courses for a major in International Relations:

- INTL 5100 Research Methods and Perspectives (3 credit hours)
- Three courses from Comparative Politics Cluster (6 credit hours)
- Three courses from International Politics Cluster (12 credit hours)
- Three International Relations Elective Courses (9 credit hours)
- INTL 6000 International Relations: Theory and Practice (3 credit hours)

### Webster University Graduate Credit Awarded

All CGSC elective courses will be reviewed annually for changes and credit recommendations may change as appropriate.

### Admission to Webster University

Requirements for admission to the CGSC Cooperative Masters Degree Program are as follows:

- This agreement between the U. S. Army Command and General Staff College and Webster University will apply to all officers completing CGSC to include U.S. Marine Corps, U.S. Air & Army National Guard, U.S. Air & Army Reserve U.S. Air Force, U.S. Navy and International Officers. All participants in the program must submit an official transcript from CGSC that reflects CGSC course work required of each degree in this program. (see note below).
- Completion of a bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited college or university, and submission of an official transcript reflecting conferral of degree.
- Completion and submission of the Webster University graduate school application form with nonrefundable application fee.
- Participants in this program are not required to complete separate graduate entrance examinations such as Graduate Record Exam (GRE), Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT), or Miller's Analogy Test (MAT). Letters of recommendation will not be required.
- All students should consult the academic policies and procedures section of the current Webster University Graduate Studies Catalog concerning admission, enrollment and academic policies.
